As it turned out it was full of caravans and motorhomes parked up, their owners cooking lunch and enjoying an en-route break. to enjoy them other than your own two feet and the desire to explore.

I had a camping first this year too, trying out an inflatable-tube tent – an Outwell Concorde 5SA – in June when we had our annual 'camping in the garden' event, which is something most of my neighbours take part in.

If tent poles get completely up your nose then an inflatable-tube tent is the answer for you. The downside is that they're quite a hefty bit of kit but the technology is great and it's relatively easy to set up, sturdy and feels really secure.

Of course the kids absolutely love it and we had lots of tent envy (no-one else had an inflatable) although there was a gorgeous old Volkswagen campervan, which obviously beats everything else hands down!

I also had the experience of being suspended in a Tentsile tent above the Thames for the launch of National Camping and Caravanning Week in May so I've certainly had my fair share of experiences involving innovative tent designs. It'll be interesting to see what tent manufacturers come up with next. Look out for a feature in next month's issue about what's new in 2018's tent line-up.

Meanwhile, I feel like I'm ahead of the curve and I can see why more and more people are going down the inflatable route!
