It's really worthwhile, in that good old-fashioned makes-you-feel-good kind

Most important, there's a lot of advice on the Keep Britain Tidy website on how to ensure your litter collection observes the very latest coronavirus

This is a great activity to do in your 'bubble', maybe with children or grandchildren. And just think about it, it's a great opportunity for our Club members - who always appreciate clean, well looked after places anyway - to give something back to the places they travel to.

The campaign will have started by the time you read this and lasts until 27 September.
