## Julia Bradbury's Irish Journey TRAVELOGUE 8.30PM, C4

When Julia goes west tonight she discovers some absolute gems while exploring the Wild Atlantic Way. From intricate knitwear and homespun wisdom (including a great yarn about an Aran shop's connection to *The Quiet Man*) to a wood sculptor's unexpected and moving contribution to the Peace Process, there's no shortage of surprises. The centrepiece, however, is the scene-stealing limestone landscape of The Burren, and, despite appearances, there's nothing barren about this rocky region. It's teeming with plantlife, a feast for foraging and hub of cattle farming. As textured as an Aran jumper, this is another magical outing of a travelogue jewel. \*\*\*\* ER
